Main problem: NEETs (16–30 y.o.) don't dispose of information
Dispersed information on opportunities for young people;

Objectives of The project

OBJECTIVE 1 : Centralise information with the help of town halls. Train civil servants from town halls on information sharing. Also we can work with NGOs. Maybe open a civic service position.

OBJECTIVE 2 : create short trainings in town halls targeting young people, NEETs especially, – as young ppl will have access to information, they will be able to better integrate in society

Actions

Criteria :

- for small town halls don't have an Internet website and minimal 4K inhabitants
- for big town halls : check what's already in the city

2. Contact trainers who are experts in the field of access to information (see the duration, the qualifications that will be attained by the trainees)

3. Contact NGOs working with NEETs

4. Train employees who are willing to participate in this;

5. Create a communication plan (Instagram, partnerships with other NGOs working with NEETs, food banks);

6. Train the youth on access to information
 7. Open civic service positions for the NEETs, whose mission will focus on access to information
 8. Dissemination of the results of the project with the help of the young participants (create a communication plan of the results);
 9. Evaluation;
